Appropriate outside members that are not members of the WSU faculty may be selected with the approval of the music faculty.

- C. Depending on the nature of the project, the student may need to enroll in Directed Readings prior to the completion of the project.
- D. Upon receiving approval of the project, the student should proceed with the project in close consultation with the committee.
- E. Upon completion of the project, the faculty committee shall meet and provide useful information to the student. Each member of the committee will assign a letter grade. These grades will be averaged for the final grade in Music 4992 (Senior Project).
