JUSTIFICATION:

These changes address problems with: (a) our current secondary degree programs and (b) add a new option that will qualify our students to teach in elementary and secondary schools with a choral or instrumental emphasis.

Current Degree Emphases

Based on a survey of our graduates, choral music education students felt the Vocal Workshop Class (MUSC 2881) was redundant with their other coursework, specifically Applied Music and Vocal Pedagogy. So we are eliminating this course for students that pursue a choral emphasis.

We have had problems with students completing an optional Senior Project (MUSC 4992) in a timely fashion. Our students are not adequately prepared to pursue this option so we are adding Directed Readings as a prerequisite for students that wish to complete Senior Project (MUSC 4992).

The current catalog requires that students enroll in a "minimum of one semester" of Internship in Music (MUSC 4860). We have had problems with this language in Cattracks. We want to change this to read a "minimum of one credit hour" of Internship in Music (MUSC 4860).

New Option

In 2007 the WSU secondary licensure program was reorganized with 10 credit hours dropped from the Teacher Education component of the program. This was done so individual departments could add content specific coursework for students that were pursuing teaching licensure. At that time Performing Arts did not pursue additional coursework for music education students. We were already accredited by

the National Association of Schools of Music (NASM) and did not feel we needed additional coursework.

During the 2008 Legislative session, \$15.82 million was appropriated over four years for the Beverly Taylor Sorenson Enhanced Learning Arts Grants Program. These funds were available to districts and charter schools through a competitive grants process to fund arts programs in elementary schools. The grant process was administered through a partnership with the Utah Arts Council and the Utah State Office of Education collaborating with Art Works For Kids! and the Utah Parent Teacher Association.

The legislature funded approximately 50 elementary schools in the state of Utah to hire well-qualified arts specialists to teach alongside certified classroom teachers over the next four years. WSU music education graduates are not eligible to participate in this program since they are not prepared to serve in elementary schools. Additionally, the Sorenson Arts Grant Program provided matching funds to school districts that currently do not have the benefit of full-time district arts coordinators to enable them to hire for such a position

The present proposal provides the opportunity for WSU music education students to seek licensure to teach music in elementary and secondary schools. This would make Sorenson Arts Grant Program available to them as well as other employment opportunities in and out of the state of Utah.

To seek the K-12 option, students will be required to complete two additional courses within the major: a) Music Teaching and Learning in the Elementary School (MUSC 3924) and an additional credit hour of b) Internship in Music (MUSC 4860). This second hour of internship will provide an early field experience in elementary music. Students seeking the K-12 option will be required to complete CHF SS1500 Human Development (3) outside of the major.

There is one program (Bachelor of Music Education) with two possible emphases: (a) Choral Music Education Emphasis with a Secondary Only Option (64-65 credit hours); (b) Instrumental Music Education Emphasis with a Secondary Only Option (65-66 credit hours). Students seeking the K-12 Option will add 5 additional credit hours.

There is one program (Bachelor of Music Education) with 2 possible emphases: (a) Choral Music Education with a Secondary Emphasis (64-65 credit hours) and b) Instrumental Music Education with a Secondary Emphasis (65-66 credit hours)
